

During the 1600s, there was a big fear of witchcraft. Before James I became King of England, he wrote a book, *Daemonologie*, telling his readers to punish those who practiced witchcraft.

In August 1612, 12 people in Lancashire were accused of witchcraft. One died in prison, one was found not guilty and the other 10 were sentenced to death at Lancaster Castle.

The trial was the result of arguments between two families. The Demdike and the Chattox had been enemies for years and in 1612, Alizon Demdike accused members of her own and the Chattox family of witchcraft.

This was likely because you could make money from claiming powers in witchcraft. The two families both wanted to be known as having the 'best powers.' This was a mistake as people's fear of witchcraft and Lancashire's reputation as being kind to Catholics meant that these claims were investigated.

This trial remains a local legend and the 10 people executed makes up 2% of all witches ever executed in England.
